"General Synod 34"

June 30-July 4 I will be attending General Synod in Indianapolis as a delegate for the Central Atlantic Conference. This will be my 8th Synod, my first as an active delegate. Each delegate is randomly assigned to a committee for one of the many resolutions coming before the synod. This year there are 15 resolutions of witness. There are also two prudential resolutions, that is, resolutions regarding policy, structure, and procedure. All of the resolutions can be found here. https://generalsynod.org/propose d-resolutions.

I have been assigned to work on two resolutions with similar content proposed by two conferences, Florida and New Hampshire, entitled, "Free from Plastic Pollution." I

preached on plastic pollution at Craigville Colloquy a few years ago, which can be found here: https://irrevrent.blogspot.com/2 019/07/love-and-science.html.

This will be a historic Synod in that we will be electing our first female General Minister and President, the Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson. There is also a proposal to change the bylaws of the UCC regarding the frequency of General Synod from every two years to every three years. Synod is always an expensive proposal, from the conference hosting the event, to the delegates and attendees, and to the national staff. Even if General Synod were to be completely online, it would not lessen the cost to the national staff budget and there would be the loss of in-person connections.

That is one of the main reasons I love going to Synod. I get to see friends from seminary, people I've worked with in Massachusetts, Ohio, and Connecticut, and the opportunity to remember once again that I am part of something a great deal larger than myself and our corner of Delaware.

There will be a prayer walk, in support of those harmed by antitrans legislation, from the convention center to the capitol grounds on July 1, the day that a gender-affirming care ban would've gone into effect in Indiana but is now blocked.

I'm proud to be part of a church and a denomination that disrupts its life for the sake of the vulnerable and marginalized in the cause of justice and love.

Palestinian Young Women
Activists Unite



Tomorrow's Women trains young women from Palestine, Israel, and the United States to be strong, compassionate leaders who form partnerships across borders to resolve conflicts and inspire action that promotes equality, peace, and justice for all. This project pro-

vides young Palestinian women with trauma healing, resiliency, and leadership training. The women will also participate in a community needs assessment to mitigate the key barriers to Palestinian young women's engagement in peacemaking. It has long been known that the inclusion of women and young people in peacebuilding efforts produces better results, more long-lasting peace, and ensures the security of women and girls. In this project, young women learn to share their stories and solutions on relevant platforms, and are provided guidance and support to drive positive change in their communities.

"Stasher Bags: I learned about these nifty silicone replacements for Ziploc bags at a zero-waste presentation I went to several months after deciding to work on reducing my waste, and was thrilled to find out they exist. Stashers are reusable, non-toxic, responsibly produced, and safe for the stovetop, microwave, oven, fridge, freezer, and dishwasher. They are supposed to be "endlessly reusable," but if they do wear out, the company has a repurposing program to convert them into safe playground pebbles. How cool is that?"



The Clothing Bank of Delaware is another program of Friendship House which offers job training during which participating women work to rebuild their reputations, renew their spirits, and reinvent themselves by discovering their potential.

Located on Jessup Street in Wilmington, the Clothing Bank of Delaware distributes clothing across Delaware. In 2022, they processed approximately 194,000 pounds of clothing, and 5,865 people received clothing from them. BENEVOLENCE RECIPIENT: HEALTHY FOODS for HEALTHY KIDS

This is the first in a series of articles to inform the congregation about each of the benevolence recipients that the Social Justice Committee has chosen for fiscal year 2023. They will be in no particular order, but Healthy Foods for Healthy Kids is the first one because we were able to watch their team in action on June 20, as their volunteers were completing a rebuild of the raised garden beds at the West Park Elementary School. The raised beds are used during the school year for planting and teaching as an accepted part of the curriculum of all grade levels.

Healthy Foods for Healthy Kids is headquartered in Hockessin, but serves the whole state of Delaware. Last year, when we looked at them statistically, they had started programs in 37 elementary schools throughout Delaware. They now have programs in 48 elementary schools, 1 pre-school, and 1 middle school. They are currently serving 22,000 students.

The curriculum is planned to coincide with the science studies at each grade level, and to allow all students to participate. Younger children learn about, plant, and water the seeds until they sprout. Middle grades study and take care of the growing plants. The upper grades learn about harvesting and making compost. When the vegetables are harvested, they are prepared for all students to eat by the school's nutrition service.

The Social Justice Committee believes that this 501c3 organization is teaching a valuable life skill to our children, and helping to make a contribution to the life of our planet.

MESSAGE from the REV. CRAIG PETERSON

Associate Conference Minister, Central Atlantic Conference UCC

As we prepare to celebrate the 4th of July next week, I know that many Americans will give thanks for the freedoms they enjoy. Sadly, many tend to think about freedom rather narrowly, in terms of what we are free **FROM**. I like to think of freedom a bit differently. I think of it in terms of what we are free **TO DO**.

At General Synod, I will celebrate the freedom we have to do things that can help heal and transform the world. Two forms these freedoms take are in the manner of Prudential Resolutions and Resolutions of Witness. These Resolutions, listed in their assigned order, encourage us to embrace the freedom to:

- Celebrate the 170th anniversary of the UCC Church Building & Loan Fund;
- Affirm licensed and commissioned ministers as authorized ministers in the UCC;
- Denounce the Dobbs decision and proclaim abortion as healthcare;
- > Call for a new study by our Church on our relationship with the Indian Boarding Schools and the Boarding Schools in Hawaii;
- Close the digital divide by seeking digital justice and inclusion;
- Urge planning for and implementing electrification;
- Advocate for intersectional and transformational healing in harm reduction;
- > Affirm "Guns to Gardens" and other gun violence prevention ministries;
- > Urge all responsible entities to join in reparations to fund Christian Hawaiian language education programs to undo a century of extinction;
- Encourage a plant-based life;
- Be free from plastic pollution;
- Support public education educators, academic freedom, and equity efforts in schools;
- Study and develop reparations proposals for African Americans;
- Condemn prolonged solitary confinement as a form of torture;
- Actively affirm the human dignity of transgender and nonbinary persons;
- > Call on UCC local churches to witness "A White Supremacy Free Zone" and confront White Supremacy.

My fervent prayer is that in the time leading up to Independence Day, you will exercise your freedom to connect to General Synod in ways whereby you can join with your siblings of faith from around the country to participate in the transformation of the world!
