"Do this in remembrance of me"

February 18-20 I attended a retreat for Central Atlantic Conference clergy and members in discernment. Our keynote speaker was the Rev. Dr. Mary Luti, who I knew from seminary days as my church history professor. Our focus was Communion—what we know, what we forget, what we ignore, and what we might become.

Mary introduced us to the Table as if it was the first time, and indeed, it was as if I had never encountered it that way before. She reminded us that it is a table of memory where we remember the

communion of the saints, where we remember and serve the poor and the despised, where we do not reminisce about Jesus but where we meet the very real presence of Christ.

Our practice at the Table is intended to shape us and our lives over time, what Mary called "communionized." Workers can unionize; servants in the service of others can become communionized. We at the New Ark have come to know Communion's meaning in a deeper way with the phrase "I am willing to disrupt my life for you," as Jesus disrupted his life for his disciples and for us. As we come to this Table repeatedly, over time it shapes us into people who are willing to disrupt our lives for others.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Our theme is "Do this in remembrance of me." Ashes to Go will be in front of the Newark Methodist Church at noon. A community Ash Wednesday service with Communion and the imposition of ashes will be held at the same location at 7:00 p.m. Choir rehearsal is at 6:15.

Lent is a season in which we engage in the spiritual practice of

disrupting our lives for other people, for something we believe in and care about. It's a season for doing service in remembrance of Jesus, that our lives would be shaped by the love he shared with the most vulnerable people he knew.

At the Table we raise to visibility those the world erases. We remember, we distribute, share, bless, give thanks, receive, eat and drink, and we proclaim the Word—God's mighty deeds in human lives. We do these things so that we do not forget.

This Lent I invite you to find ways to do these things in remembrance of Jesus and let your life be transformed by these actions.

Let these words by Kris Kristofferson that John Flynn shared with us be our Lenten mantra, as we remember Jesus.

Tell the truth.

Sing with passion.

Work with laughter.

Love with heart.

Many of us feel so unsettled right now for a lot of reasons—personal, professional, and political. My father has been in the hospital and my siblings and I have been working and taking "shifts" at the hospital. A one-day procedure has turned into weeks due to complications. Intubated and sedated, we tell him he will be okay, that he is getting better *and* that it is *okay* to get angry. His anger keeps him feisty and fighting to get home. We are angry that he is in this situation; we can only imagine his anxiety over the confusion and loss of control.

As I describe my father's situation, I flash to my public school and church communities and to the political climate, and I have some déjà vu: unsettled feelings for those we love, feeling anxious, and feeling mad. Pastor Cynthia advised that it is okay to feel angry; it gives purpose to our feelings. I also heard Pastor Cynthia advise us not to let anyone steal our joy. That resonates! I am angry and unsettled, but I have purpose, and I will find joy where I can. Just as I lean into my own family, I will lean into my church family for support and hope. I urge you all to do the same: lean into the New Ark and continue to find joy where you can.


HIGHMARK WALK for FRIENDSHIP HOUSE

IN SEARCH of 2025 BENEVOLENCE RECIPIENTS

Each year, the Social Justice Committee chooses small, local organizations to whom our NAUCC benevolence funds could make a difference. We will distribute our \$6500 among those who work for peace and justice, hunger, housing, and the environment this year. We try to balance those who work to alleviate immediate needs and those who work for systemic change.

In 2024, our benevolence funds went to the Delaware Center for Justice, Delaware Interfaith Power & Light, Exceptional Care for Children, Family Hope Coalition, Healthy Foods for Healthy Kids, Hope Dining Room, Housing Alliance Delaware, Lori's Hands, Meeting Ground, and 1 in 7B. We also gave scholarship monies to the Lenape, the Nanticoke, and the Newark NAACP.

What is Net Zero?

Delaware's long-term greenhouse gas emissions goal is a recognition that it is vital to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions to as close to zero as possible by 2050 to avert the worst-case impacts of climate change. In many economic sectors this is achievable with current and emerging technologies. However, it is expected that by 2050, a few industries may still be in the process of transitioning away from fossil fuels. This is why, instead

of zero emissions, we aim for net-zero emissions.

Carbon sequestration actions, such as planting trees, restoring ecosystems, and investing in new carbon capture technology, can help remove excess carbon dioxide from the atmosphere. So long as the amount of carbon dioxide removed from the atmosphere is equal to the amount emitted like draining a tub as fast as you are filling it—the level of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere won't rise. That's what we call Net Zero: a realistic, attainable goal that accounts for both the opportunities and limitations of current technology.







ONE GREAT HOUR of SHARING

March 30, 2025



Each year, on one Sunday in Lent, several Christian denominations, including the United Church of Christ, participate in the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS). Funds from OGHS are used by each denomination to relieve the suffering and pain caused by natural disasters, by war, by famine, by extreme poverty, and by pandemics throughout the world.

Because of the generosity of UCC members, over the past few years the UCC and its partners have provided disaster relief for hurricane victims in Puerto Rico, the US Virgin Islands, North Carolina, Texas, and Louisiana; assistance to the victims of forest fires in California; help to Earthquake victims in Puerto Rico, Mexico, Indonesia, and Haiti; and aid to persons left homeless due to flooding in Texas, Mississippi, El Salvador, Hawaii, and South India.

The UCC, with funding from OGHS, has also provided relief and support for persons

displaced from their homes due to conflict and violence throughout the world. Recent years have been particularly difficult due to the worldwide spread of the coronavirus in refugee camps and in other places with minimal sanitation and health services. The UCC has struggled to balance all of the needs and demands for support and assistance. Our donations can make a significant difference at this critical time.


